Course Assignments:

Midterm Examination – An in-class midterm examination will be held on 7/20/04.

Term Paper – Students may choose to write a term paper on the effective treatment of a mental disorder of their choice. The paper should include the following:

- A. Historical and theoretical origins of the treatment approach.
- B. Description of the treatment approach
- C. Review of evidence of effectiveness
- D. Contraindications
- E. Diversity Issues
- F. Discussion/Implications for social work practice

Alternative topics for the term paper may be considered (i.e., description of a novel or innovative treatment approach), but the student must obtain pre-approval from the instructor. The paper is due at the beginning of class on 7/20/04.

The text of the paper should be no longer than 20 pages and should follow the style conventions of the *Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association, 5th Edition*. Further, all papers must be in 12pt type, Times New

Roman or Courier font, double spaced, and with 1 inch margins on all sides. Points may be deducted for failure to follow APA style and format.

Grade Distribution:

Students have the choice between two grade distributions Plan A or Plan B, depending on whether or not a Term Paper is completed. The Midterm and Final Examinations are mandatory for all students. However, the Term Paper is optional.
