Each agency website will provide additional information about the placement and the population(s) served. Circumstances within each agency change on a fairly frequent basis - which means that at any specific time, a placement may not be accepting students, or may already have a student for the semester/year. This information is maintained by your Field Coordinator. Any questions regarding a placement should be directed to the Field Coordinator. Feel free to review as many sites as possible to increase your knowledge of the possible options. If an agency is not listed - please contact your Field Coordinator to determine whether an agreement with this agency may be pursued.

It is very important NOT TO CONTACT THE FIELD SITES ON YOUR OWN! If you are interested in a Field Placement, please contact your BSSW Field Coordinator. There are specific individuals within the agency that interact with the Field Coordinator on a regular basis. Additional contacts made directly by students may interfere with a successful placement.

The placement sites are listed alphabetically with a brief description of the agency and a link to an available website. The placements are identified as accepting Junior and/or Senior students. Each selected agency will provide students with generalist practice experience. Care has been taken to ensure each placement site provides opportunities to meet all 11 competencies on the BSSW Learning Plan. NOT ALL PLACEMENTS ACCEPT BOTH JUNIOR AND SENIOR STUDENTS.

Once you have explored agencies of interest. Fill out a Junior/Senior Field Planning Sheet (found under BSSW field forms) and submit to the Field Coordinator. This will increase your chances of being placed in an agency and with a population of your choice.
