The Memphis Campus of the University of Tennessee MSSW Program partners with agencies throughout the metropolitan Shelby County area and surrounding counties, as well as with neighboring agencies in Mississippi and Arkansas, to provide student field placements. Every effort is made to develop and maintain a comprehensive array of options representing all of the varied fields of social work practice. This roster is dynamic as agencies and programs open and evolve.

The list you will find below is intended to provide students with information regarding the agencies with whom the College of Social Work is currently affiliated and the types of learning experiences available at each site. Students should use this information to prepare for planning meetings with the Field Coordinator and for agency interviews. If a specific agency of interest does not appear on this list, students may contact the Field Coordinator to request that the agency be contacted to explore development of an affiliation. Students may also contact the Field Coordinator to explore development of a specific type of learning experience. Agencies are listed alphabetically. However, a list of types of placements is also included for your reference.

Please remember to follow the field placement planning process specified by the Field Coordinator. This placement process is intended to promote and maintain a positive relationship with each agency and a fair and individualized planning process for each student. Some agencies have specific contact persons, procedures, and timelines for the process. Students are not to contact agencies or field instructors without prior authorization and instructions from the Field Coordinator. Please contact your Field Coordinator if you have any questions about the agencies or the planning process. Be advised that circumstances, including staffing, within each agency change frequently. This means that, during any given semester, an agency may not be accepting students. The Field Coordinator can advise students as to the actual availability of specific placements.

AGAPE houses the largest faith-based counseling center in the Mid-South. It offers pre-marital, anger, stress and addiction counseling services. AGAPE offers Christ-centered counseling for individuals, couples and families and proactive educational programs. The aim is to help people to recognize, deal with and prevent problems. Adoption services are also offered where students can work with birth and adoptive parents and families.

Flexible hours are not offered and there is no stipend.

This agency assists older adults and adults with disabilities in leading an independent, meaningful, and dignified life in their own homes as long as possible. Services are committed to disabilities assistance, advocacy, and answers on aging for Seniors and Disabled persons over the age of 18. The internship is with the agency's Guardianship program, which is responsible for guardianship and conservatorship of individuals who cannot manage their own affairs and who have no family members or members in close proximity who can manage for them. This requires working with attorneys (pro bono) and the court system. The student will be involved with networking with community agencies, determining alternative living arrangements, advocacy, posting petitions, assisting with managing the Advisory Council, conducting surveys, conducting research, working with legislative issues, resource development, educating the general public on guardianship and conservatorship issues, and monitoring and evaluating the projects/activities of the Guardianship Program. The student will also be involved with the ethics of fiduciary services and accounting.

Stipends are dependent upon individual grants and are, therefore, not guaranteed. Flexible hours are not offered.

Catholic Charities is composed of six divisions providing more than 30 community programs. The services and programs include extended childcare, homeless services for men, women, and children who are affected by domestic violence, mental dysfunction, alcohol and drug abuse, and chronic homelessness. The agency provides treatment, emergency assistance, local and international adoption assistance for birth and adoptive parents, intrastate and international relocation services, and volunteer opportunities. Sophia's House serves abused women and children, Genesis House serves the dually diagnosed client, and Dozier House provides treatment for alcohol and drug addictions. The student can rotate during the academic year to each of the facilities.

Evening and weekend placements are limited to Sophia's House. No stipend is offered.

Students placed here will gain experience in the Skilled Care, Restorative Care, Cardiovascular Unit, the Emergency Room, and on the regular floors. The primary responsibilities of the intern will include discharge planning, developing and utilizing community resources, conducting psychosocial assessments, providing supportive counseling and crisis intervention, conducting family information sessions, making referrals on child abuse and neglect and for vulnerable adults, and contacting homeless shelters. Stipends are provided and students receive a caseload of patients; therefore, a student in this placement will have to negotiate for time off from the hospital during the break between the Fall and Spring semesters. Arrangements are offered in the emergency room for students needing evening and weekend placements. This area is fast-paced and short-term.

Note: This agency has not accepted students for the 2007-08 academic year and has not renewed the Memorandum of Agreement.

The mission of the social work department/staff at this hospital is to provide a quality-focused, patient-centered continuum of care and delivery of services that meets the emotional, physical, and spiritual needs of its customers and to enhance the patient's quality of life and outcomes in a timely manner.

While discharge planning is part of the training, students placed here will be will gain experience in the Skilled Care, Restorative Care, Cardiovascular, and Emergency Room services, as well as on the regular floors with an assigned caseload. The primary responsibilities of the intern will include discharge planning, developing and utilizing community resources, conducting psychosocial assessments, providing supportive counseling and crisis intervention, conducting family information sessions, making referrals on child abuse and neglect and for vulnerable adults, and contacting homeless shelters. Group experience is also available; however, is tailored to the student's needs.

This unit provides restorative care, case management, discharge planning and individual and family counseling. Students placed here will gain experience in the Skilled Care, Restorative Care, Cardiovascular Unit, the Emergency Room and on the regular floors. The primary responsibilities of the intern will include discharge planning, developing and utilizing community resources, conducting psychosocial assessments, providing supportive counseling, crisis intervention, conducting family information sessions, making referrals on child abuse and neglect and for vulnerable adults and contacting homeless shelters. The field instructor will arrange for students to provide group sessions and to work in the Women's Hospital if that is desired.

This agency provides care to terminally ill patients in their home environment. Beyond pain management related to end-of-life issues, Baptist Trinity Hospice takes an interdisciplinary approach to care by meeting the physiological, sociological, educational, spiritual, and emotional needs of the patient and his or her family.

The interdisciplinary team, guided by the patient's attending physician and hospice medical director, may include registered nurses, certified nursing assistants, social workers, a chaplain, physical therapists, bereavement counselors, a speech pathologist, and volunteers who enable terminally ill individuals to live their lives where most want to—in their own homes surrounded by family and friends. Baptist Trinity Hospice offers bereavement assistance to families for 13 months after the death of their loved one. Bereavement social workers are available to walk families through their grief process, and several different types of grief programs are available free of charge to grieving community members of all ages. Baptist Trinity Hospice provides age-appropriate grief support groups for children, teenagers, and adults that allow bereaved individuals to share their thoughts and feelings under the guidance of a professional bereavement staff in a safe environment.

The Center houses the Shelby County Child Protection Investigation Team subunit, facilitates the multidisciplinary approach to intervention, investigation, prosecution, and treatment of abuse, conducts forensic interviews and evaluations, and provides electronic case tracking across systems.
